THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER & TRIBUTARIES PROJECT (MR&T)

Authorized by the 1928 Flood Control Act. In the wake of the devastating 1927 flood, it was deemed necessary to put into place a comprehensive, unified system of public works within the lower Mississippi Valley that would provide unprecedented flood risk management and an equally efficient navigation channel. Major features include Channel Improvement and Stabilization, Floodways, Levees/Floodwalls, and Tributary Basin Improvements that work together to provide flood risk management, navigation, and foster environmental protection and enhancement.

NAVIGATION AND ECOSYSTEM SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM (NESP)

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The Navigation and Ecosystem Sustainability Program (NESP) was authorized by Congress in 2007 with the goal of long-term sustainability of the navigation and ecosystem uses on the Nationally-significant Upper Mississippi River. Funding to advance projects into construction was first received as part of the 2022 Bi-Partisan Infrastructure Law and continued through fiscal years 2022-2024 via Congressionally Directed Spending and USACE Work Plan. The program continues to advance planning, design, and construction for priority navigation and ecosystem projects on the Upper Mississippi and Illinois Rivers.
