
The 2014 Farm Bill and NRCS Easement Programs

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What's in the Farm Bill?

(Costs from FY 2014-2023)



- Food Stamps and Nutrition,\$756 billion
- Crop Insurance, \$89.8 billion
- Conservation, \$56 billion
- Commodity Programs, \$44.4 billion
- Everything Else, \$8.2 billion

WRP Purpose and Emphasis

- The main purpose is to restore, protect, and enhance wetlands on eligible private or tribal lands while maximizing wildlife habitat benefits.
- Emphasis is placed on habitat for migratory birds and other wetland dependent wildlife including T/E species and species of concern.
- Application is voluntary
- Other objectives are:
 - Protection and improvement of water quality
 - Flood water storage
 - Recharge of groundwater
 - Protection and enhancement of open space and aesthetic quality
 - Protection of native flora and fauna




Land Eligibility

- Land is capable of having wetland hydrology and hydric vegetation restored.
- Only private land or land owned by Indian Tribes is eligible.
- Landowner must provide legal Ingress/Egress to NRCS.
- Landowner must provide clear title.
- Own land for 2-years prior to enrollment (waiver capability).
- Compliant with Highly Erodible Lands and Wetlands with FSA (sodbuster and swampbuster provisions of Farm Bill).
- Compliant with Adjusted Gross Income (AGI)
 - Three year average of Adjusted Gross Non-Farm Income cannot exceed \$900,000.
 - At least 50% of the easement must be restorable

Easements and Cost Share

- WRP has three enrollment options from which the Landowner can choose at the time of application:
 - Permanent Easement (1-time easement payment, 100% Restoration)
 - 30 year Easement (75% of the 1-time easement payment, 75% Restoration)
